


House **prices**


Over the last couple of years, the Romford property market has boomed, leading to a natural inflation of house prices, flats and renting fees.








What to expect from living in Romford?

Considered one of the most significant towns on the east side of London, Romford gives homeowners the best of both worlds.

You can expect plenty of shops, easy transport links into the capital, family-friendly housing and the buzz of city life. With the Essex countryside on your doorstep, it's also perfect for those who enjoy the great outdoors and getting lost in nature.

Romford has an abundance of property types, from new builds, to 1930's Victorian terrace houses. So there is bound to be something that suits your interests and needs.





Transportation links

Trains: Romford has a central station located in London zone 6. It offers regular trains into London Liverpool Street, Stratford and Southend Central. With the opening of the new Elizabeth Line, commuters can expect fast and easy journeys into central London.

Cars: Romford has easy access to major roads including the A12, A13 and A127. Throughout the area, there are a number of controlled parking zones.

Bus: There is a good bus service running to the different neighbourhoods. Some buses also run directly into central London.

Airports: London City Airport and Stansted can be reached within 45 minutes. On the Elizabeth Line, travellers can catch a direct train to Heathrow Airport.





Schools in the local area

Primary: There are several primary schools within Romford that are rated 'outstanding' by OFSTED. These include Concordia Academy, St Peter's Catholic Primary School, St Bede's Catholic Primary School and Warren Junior School.

Secondary: Most of the secondary schools in Romford are rated 'good' by OFSTED including The Frances Bardsley Academy for Girls, St Edward's Church of England Academy, The Royal Liberty School and Marshalls Park Academy.

Further education: Romford has a number of stand alone colleges. These include Havering College of Further and Higher Education and Barking and Dagenham College.

There are also a number of private schools in the area.

Local amenities

Shopping: There are several shopping centres in the area. These include The Liberty, The Brewery and The Mercury Shopping Centre. There is also a market every Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.

Entertainment: Romford offers an abundance of pubs, restaurants, cinemas and bowling alleys. The Brookside Theatre hosts many productions from live music to plays. You can also visit the old Greyhound Stadium to see frequent dog races.

Libraries: Romford has a local library that is open 6 days a week.

Healthcare: There are around 28 GPs in the Romford area. The nearest hospitals are Queen's Hospital and Victoria Hospital.





Sports and Leisure

Romford has its very own football club, Romford Football Club which is part of the Essex Senior League.

You can also find the Romford Bowls Club, a premier Essex bowls club, the Romford and Gidea Park Rugby Club and The Raiders ice hockey team.

If you enjoy playing golf, there are 3 renowned golf courses in Romford. Each offer a variety of holes and a driving range.

There are several sports complexes in the area where you can take a range of classes and enjoy sporting activities.





Outdoor spaces

Considered one of the greenest boroughs of London, Havering is part of the Metropolitan Green Belt meaning most of its green spaces are protected from development.

Raphael Park is the most popular public park in Romford - it contains a mix of woodland, fields, play areas for kids, beautiful lakeside walks and an open air theatre.

Around 30 minutes away you can reach Hainault Forest and Epping Forest where you can enjoy exploring the woodlands of these epic landscapes.

For fans of the seaside, Southend beach is only a 45 minute drive away from Romford. Home to Adventure Island theme park, the Sealife centre and the longest pleasure pier in the world.
